### **More than \$2.4 million in capital improvements**

In 2010, we invested more than \$2.4 million in our facility which included the renovation of technology upgrade to the Sleep Lab. In addition, our New Mexico Sinus Institute also achieved recognition as a center of excellence for sinus treatment. Other improvements included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and important facility upkeep and maintenance.

### **Contributing to our local tax base**

Last year, LAMC paid nearly \$2.1 million in taxes that have helped to support our county and state. These dollars help support local schools, the development of roads, the recruitment of business and industry, and other vital community services.

### **Helping those in need**

LAMC provided more than \$20.4 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$2.4 million for charity care and bad debts incurred as we served many people without the financial resources to pay for basic health care.

### **Adding new physicians**

Los Alamos Medical Center added five new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in nephrology, internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, family practice and inpatient care.

### **One of our community's major employers**

With an annual payroll of more than \$21.1 million and 319 employees, LAMC is one of the largest employers in the region. This means that our staff and their families attend many of the same schools, shop at the same grocery stores, volunteer their time and resources for the same non-profits as do you and your family.
